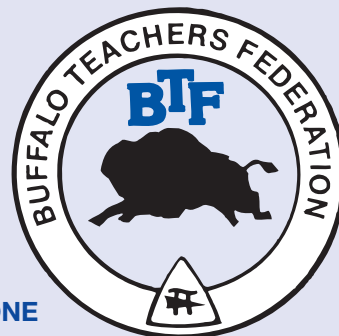


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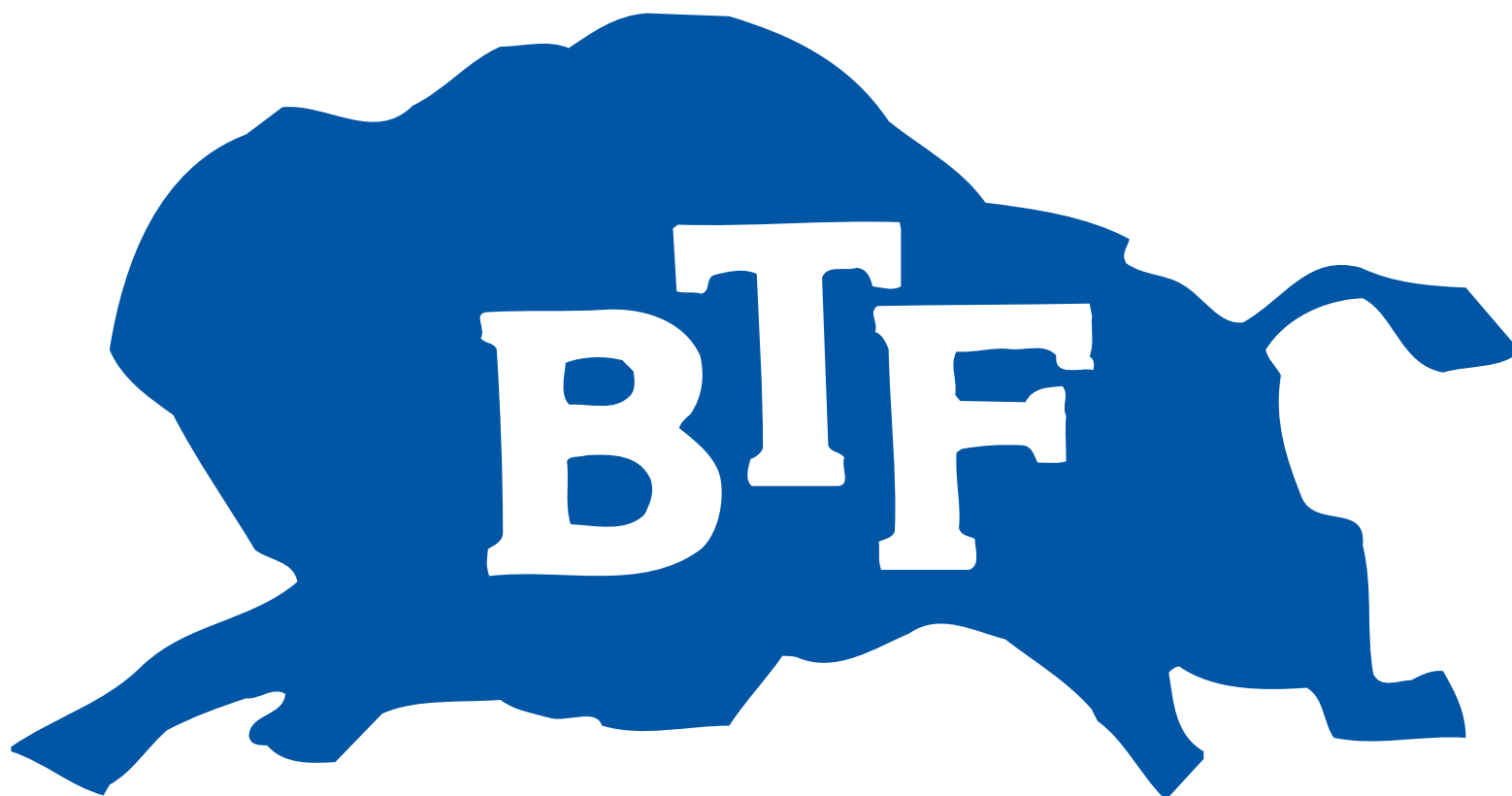

As I reflect on the 27 years I've worked as an educator, serving you as president of the BTF these last two years has been my greatest honor. Your belief in Melinda and me to staunchly advocate for and support you and your work is a responsibility we eagerly embrace. Thanks to the trust and confidence you have in us and our vision of growing our union by reaching out to all members, our BTF is moving in a positive direction that will continue to build in strength.

I'm proud to share just some of the wins for BTF these last two years:

- Secured \$30k NYSUT grant
- Secured continuing member engagement grants for the next two years with access up to \$60k
- Created ongoing, comprehensive member and delegate trainings
- Upgraded BTF systems
 - New member information system with tighter cyber security
 - New VoIP phone system (saving BTF over \$2k/year while providing more accessibility functions (e.g., messaging and voicemails))
- Launched BTF app for union communications
- Established Labor/Management meetings yielding many favorable MOUs for our members (e.g., last 2 calendars have teachers working fewer days than the maximum 188 days... something that has NEVER happened in all my years in this district)

- APPR Performance Chart MOU broadening teacher Effective score range
- Held weekly grievance meetings to work through an active grievance backlog that spanned nearly 20 years! Where once the Federation filed 100-200 grievances per year, we now file 35-45 per year. Labor/Management meetings, building committee meetings, and monthly meetings with the superintendent have reduced the paper log jam allowing us to address many problems quickly at the root before we had to grieve them

We are currently working on:

- Contract negotiations (beginning this summer)
- Negotiating APPR 3012-e
- New interactive website (under development)
- Transitioning from paper-only forms to digital form options for changes to Extended Pay, Death Benefits, etc.

We have accomplished many of the goals we set out to achieve these last 22 months and are energized by the increased member involvement. We are eager to build on these successes to continue to tackle the work that lies ahead. So many factors determine the success, strength, and legacy of our union. But none are more important than each member's involvement, engagement, and voice. Your voice! And so, I humbly ask for your continued support and your vote. Let's keep up this momentum and continue to move our union forward together.

- We have developed several training opportunities for our members such as Delegate 101, When the Principal Calls, SBMT, Taylor Law and others.
- We have changed office technology. The new upgrades to the computer systems and the upcoming improvements will make our SBF and information systems easier for you to navigate. Our new BTF app has streamlined our interactions with members.

- We secured a grant from NYSUT for the Local Action Project that provided us with funding for many of our internal upgrades.
- We have included many more teachers in the NYSUT committees to engage our members.
- We have made a concerted effort to include all teachers in committees and training courses such as the Kripalu and Social Justice Academy.
- We have enhanced the SBF benefits to teachers and increased activities our Social committee has planned such as Trivia night, Buffalo Bandits game, bowling, Happy Hour at Canalside, and a Miss Buffalo Boat ride, to name a few.
- We successfully helped two candidates who are pro-teacher and pro-education win seats on the school board.
- We have had substantially more participants in our labor movement as evidenced by the fun Labor Day picnic and parade.

I have been so energized by our teachers who volunteer on a regular basis and hope that Rich and I can realize our vision of a proactive union that serves all of us. I am thankful for your trust and humbly ask for your vote. Thank you for your support.

Dear Colleagues,

I am seeking your support in my candidacy for BTF President.

Union advocacy has always been part of my life. Raised in a union family, I helped establish a union at my first teaching job and have been an active BTF member serving as a building alternate, delegate, building committee member, SBMT member, and Executive Committee member. Additionally, I represent

educators as a delegate for NYSTRS, NYSUT RA, AFT, and NEA. I also serve as secretary for the Teacher Center Policy Board and co-chair of NYSUT's English Language Arts Subject Area Committee (ELASAC), where I advocate for meaningful classroom changes at the state level.

With 27 years as a secondary English teacher in Buffalo Public Schools (BPS), I understand the growing challenges we face—rising school violence, declining test scores, and a lack of parental and administrative support. We must unite, strengthen our ties with the community, and demand safer schools. When schools are safe, learning improves. But we, as educators, cannot fully support students when our own needs are ignored.

As a lifelong union member, I have always fought for our profession. If elected BTF President, I will work alongside Mel Holden as Vice President to strengthen our union, improve communication, and ensure YOUR voices are heard. Together, we will push for necessary APPR reforms

that allow teachers to focus on teaching while administrators provide real support for our most at-risk students. I've never hesitated to speak up on our behalf when leadership diminishes our work.

The issues in our classrooms—violence, student apathy, inadequate special education placements, and poor working conditions must be addressed. Too often, we teach in filthy classrooms, extreme temperatures, and unsafe conditions with little district accountability. Promises mean nothing without action.

Another critical challenge is our next BTF contract, set for negotiations in Fall 2025. Having served on the previous negotiations team, I am prepared to fight for a strong contract. While our last agreement secured pay increases, many issues remain. I will ensure every member has a voice in shaping our proposals.

If elected, I will ensure BTF leadership is responsive to all members. Your contractual rights will be upheld, grievances will be filed when necessary, and arbitration will be pursued when the district fails us. Our union must be strong, united, and unwavering.

Together, we can create real change. I would be honored to have your support.

- annual publication of the CPA audit report of BTF finances

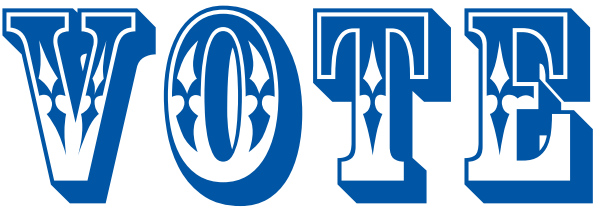

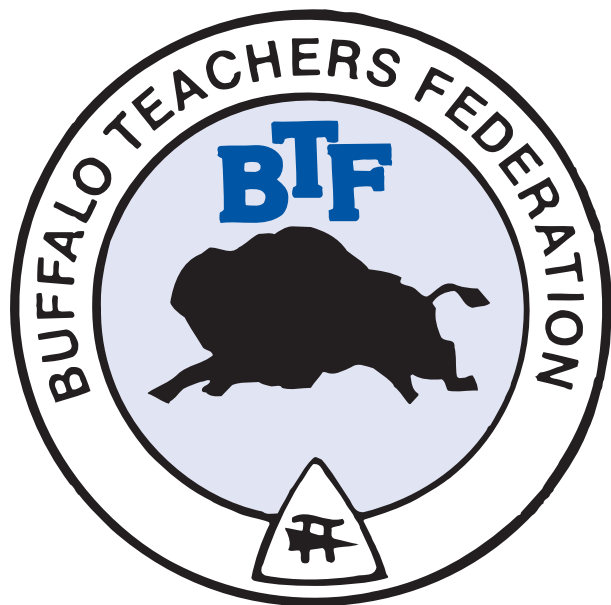
